On a tour, if you have a knowledgeable guide, they will show you both the Hagia Sophia and the Blue Mosque.


3. The Grand Bazaar

One of the most famous features is the Medusa heads, which are carved into two columns. It's a fun and free place to explore if you want to see something different and ancient in Istanbul!


5. The Chora Church (Kariye Museum)

You can visit different parts of the palace, like the Harem, where the sultan's family lived. It's a fun place to learn about history and see how royalty used to live.


7. The Galata Tower
